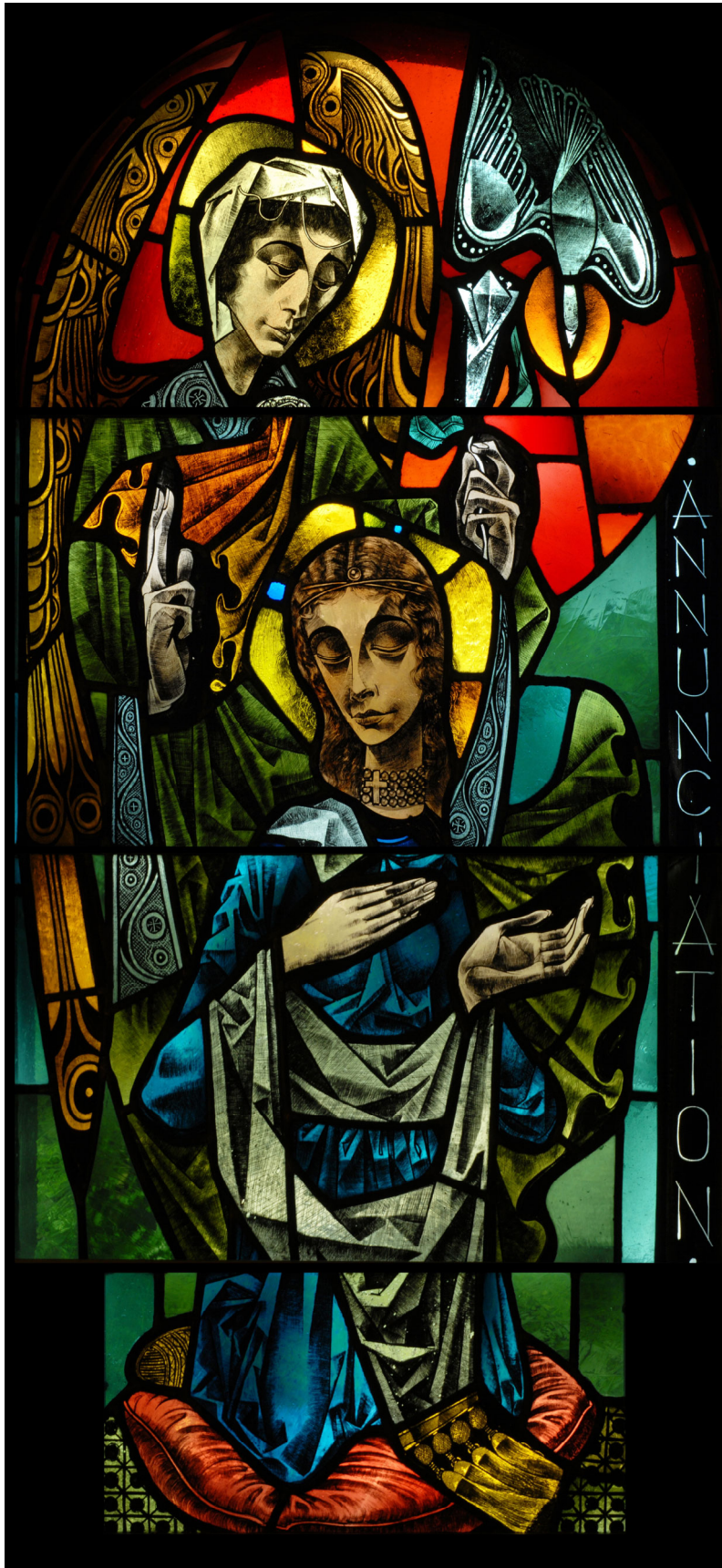

FROM OUR PASTOR.....

EVERYBODY TOGETHER

Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski, all the Priests and Deacons of the Archdiocese, are happy to offer the invitation to return to Sunday Mass. As the world moves forward on the path of healing, an essential part is to gather together again to experience the Eucharist in its fullest form. Nothing can substitute for receiving the Real Presence of the Risen Christ in the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

On July 1, 2021, Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski will lift the dispensation to attend Sunday Mass for all the faithful in the Archdiocese of St. Louis —meaning that we will all be called to return to Holy Mass in-person each Sunday. (We understand that these are uncertain times for everyone, and we want all to feel safe returning to Mass. Those who are sick, homebound, immunocompromised and gravely concerned for their health are exempt from the obligation to attend Mass, which has always been the case in normal times.)

While we will continue to live stream our Masses that have been such a blessing for many during the pandemic, it is important to note that watching the Mass is not the same thing as being there in Church, and is not a proper substitute when one is able attend.

Jesus gave us the Sunday Eucharist as the source and summit of our Catholic life. The other Sacraments, our private prayer and devotion, and the good works that flow from our faith are all essentially connected and oriented to the Eucharist. At the heart of our Catholic Faith is the truth that Jesus, the Risen Son of God, is really present in the Eucharist. Jesus gives Himself to us in the new Covenant as our spiritual food and drink. Our participation in the Eucharist acknowledges and effects our right relationship with God and with the Community. It is the best thing we can do for ourselves and others.



WHICH SAFETY PRECAUTIONS ARE CONTINUING?

In Church, Masks are optional for those who are FULLY VACCINATED. FOR THOSE WHO ARE NOT VACCINATED, it is necessary to wear a Mask for the entire Mass except to receive Holy Communion. The distribution of the Chalice of the Precious Blood during Holy Communion remains prohibited. The Sign of Peace is suspended until physical touch can be restored. We will continue to use ONLY EVERY OTHER PEW and Holy Communion will be brought to you in the pew by the Priest, Deacon, or Eucharistic Minister.

At this time, there will not be Holy Water in the fonts. Offerings for the Church and special collections are greatly appreciated and may be put in the collection boxes at the Church entrances. We do not have an Offertory procession at Mass for the time being. This is a rolling start for the return to normalcy. More changes will be added in the coming weeks. I thank you for your incredible patience, prayers, and support in these difficult times.

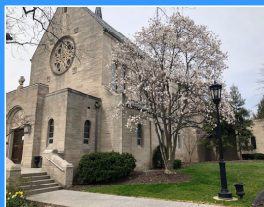
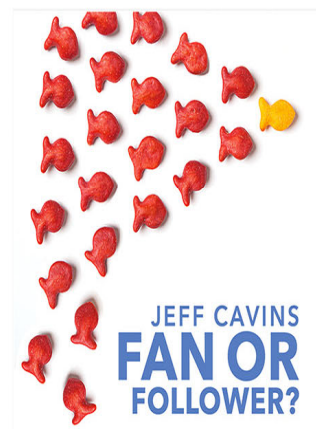

Bridges Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius in Everyday Life

***Are you looking for a deeper prayer life
and a closer relationship with God?***

If so, please consider the “Bridges Retreat in Everyday Life,” based on the 450+ year-old Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola. This nine-month retreat is designed and adapted for persons in all walks of life. The retreat consists of daily prayer and journaling (experiencing discernment, contemplation, meditation), in addition to weekly or monthly small group meetings and weekly time with a prayer companion who listens to your experiences and provides oral and written guidance through the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola. The retreat runs September into May and coincides with the Church’s liturgical calendar.

The retreat begins in September 2021, and information sessions (like the retreat) will be offered at five Greater St. Louis-area sites on various days and times this summer, as well as a virtual “Zoom” session. 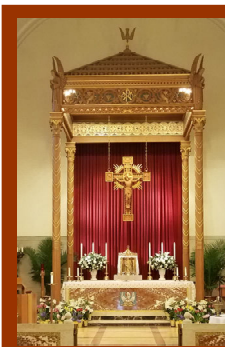
