## FROM OUR PASTOR.....




Throughout Respect Life Month we ask for the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe to protect all human life. Our Lady of Guadalupe told St. Juan Diego, "You who are my messenger, in you I place my absolute trust."

The essence of our identity is that we are created in God's image and likeness and loved by Him. Nothing can diminish the priceless worth of any human life. Every person is *cherished*. God creates every person for eternal union with Himself and continually invites us to

embrace a loving relationship with Him. Every person is **chosen**. We are called to be messengers of God's love, treating one another as cherished and chosen by Him. In doing so, we help build a culture that respects all human life. Every person is **sent**.

#### THIS OCTOBER—PRAY THE ROSARY

Over one hundred years ago, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal with an urgent message for the whole world. Mary identified herself as Our Lady of the Rosary and urged the children and the whole world to pray the rosary daily for peace in the world, to make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners, and to draw closer to her Son, Jesus. In this month of October, let us also pray the rosary for a greater understanding of the sacredness of all human life, the protection of the unborn, the elderly, and all those who have no one to advocate for them.



The **Five Joyful Mysteries** are traditionally prayed on Mondays, Saturdays, and, during the season of Advent, on Sundays:

- 1. The Annunciation
- 2. The Visitation
- 3. The Nativity
- 4. The Presentation in the Temple
- 5. The Finding in the Temple

The **Five Glorious Mysteries** are traditionally prayed on Wednesdays and, outside the seasons of Advent and Lent, on Sundays:

- 1. The Resurrection
- 2. The Ascension
- 3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit
- 4. The Assumption
- 5. The Coronation of Mary

#### The Five Sorrowful

**Mysteries** are traditionally prayed on Tuesdays, Fridays, and, during the season of Lent, on Sundays:

- 1. The Agony in the Garden
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar
- 3. The Crowning with Thorns
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross
- 5. The Crucifixion and Death

#### The Five Luminous

**Mysteries** are traditionally prayed on Thursdays:

- 1. The Baptism of Christ in the Jordan
- 2. The Wedding Feast at Cana
- 3. Jesus' Proclamation of the Coming of the Kingdom of God
- 4. The Transfiguration
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist



That being said, I don't always have the courage to correct those around me who make this grave mistake. One of my close friends says "Oh my G\_d!" multiple times when we're together. I say a prayer of sorrow to our Father every time, because I know how it hurts Him. But, is this enough? Probably not. One of my daughter's middle school friends also says it a lot, and it has somewhat desensitized my daughter, as I heard her say it last night while she was on the phone. I jumped up and yelled at her... "Oh, sorry, Mom! Sorry! It was an accident!" "You know better! That's one of the absolute worst things you can say," I replied.

In retrospect, maybe I should have told her to get off the phone and apologize to the Father. Then again, forcing my 14 year old to hang up could backfire. Also, the name of God is the most beautiful word any of us can say, when said in the context of prayer. God gave us His name so that we might call upon Him as the humble, loving children that we are, or at least ought to be. He is our Father. Would we treat our parents with such disrespect?
