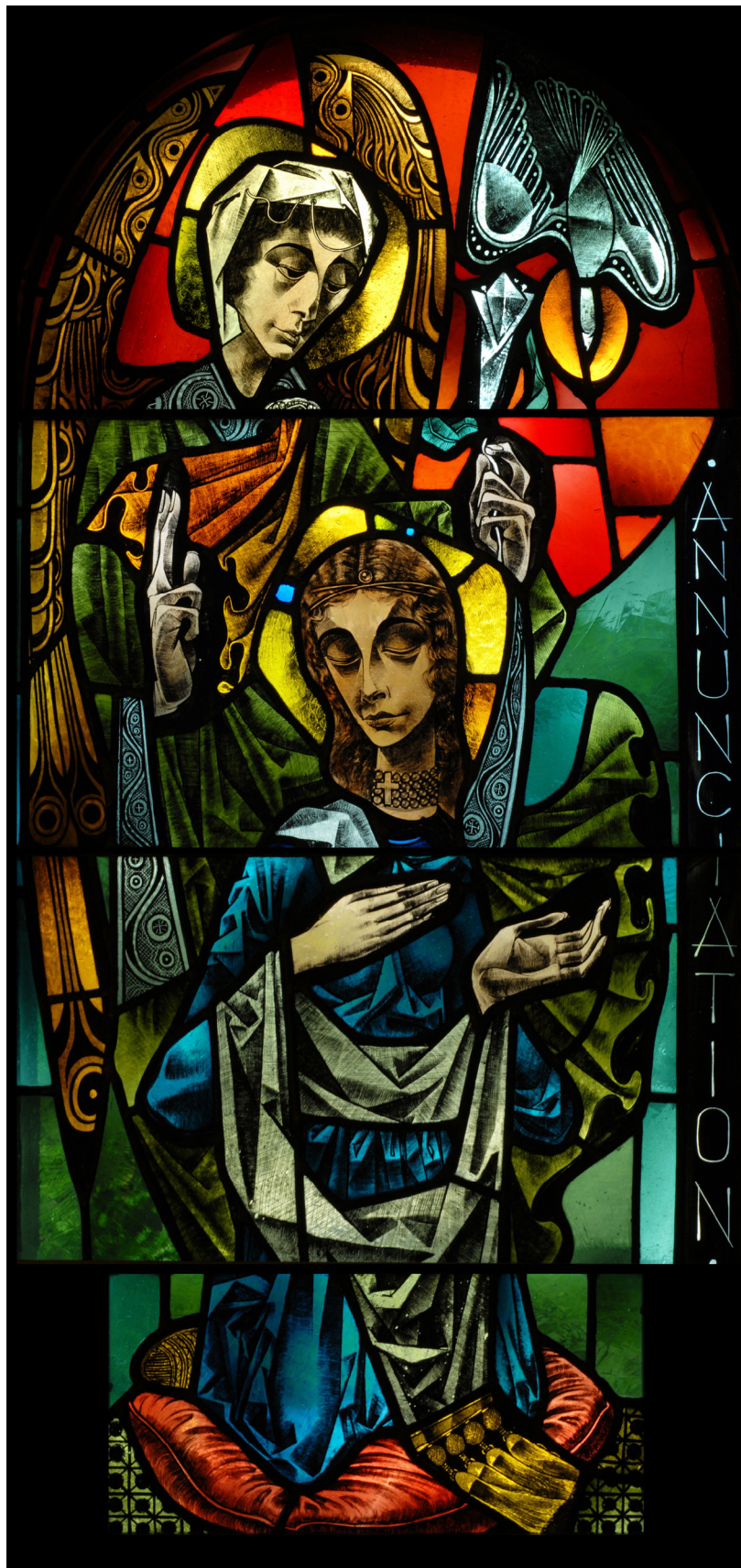

FROM OUR PASTOR.....

NEW LIFE IN THE TIME OF COVID-19

In 10 days, the Lord will not send a text, or an e-mail, or any kind of electronic communication. In the words of St. Teresa of Calcutta, you will be offered the opportunity of a lifetime: ASH WEDNESDAY and the SEASON OF LENT can change your relationship with God and with others if you would take 10 minutes a day to be alone with God who dwells in our hearts. God speaks in the silence of our heart. Listening is the beginning of PRAYER.



In prayer you can find inner peace, strength, and direction for your life. Perhaps this year, in the silence, God may show you a new direction to go for the 40 days of Lent. One such direction is the corporal works of mercy which are based on Jesus' words in the Gospel regarding the separation of the sheep and the goats.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that, "The works of mercy are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbor in their spiritual and bodily necessities." In particular, the corporal (bodily) works of mercy are based on the words of Jesus:

"He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right, Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me."

These works of mercy are essential, concrete, and tangible ways that we can follow the example of Jesus and live out our Catholic Faith. The Church lists the corporal works of mercy as follows:

1. Feeding the hungry
2. Giving drink to the thirsty
3. Sheltering the homeless
4. Clothing the naked
5. Visiting the sick
6. Visiting the imprisoned
7. Burying the dead

Each of these works of mercy can be done in a number of ways and is not a strict definition, but is more broad in scope. For example, you don't have to physically bury the dead to accomplish this work of mercy. Arranging for the funeral of a family member or a friend is an example of living it.

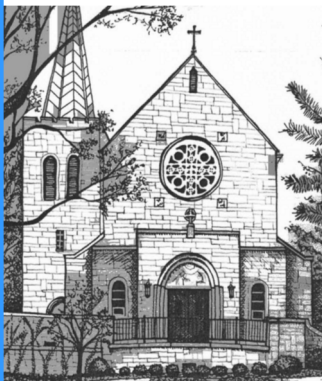

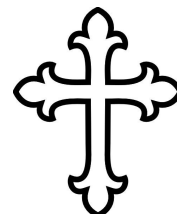
