LENTEN PARISH MISSION

I am delighted that Father Charles Samson will lead us in this year's Mission. Father will preach the Sunday Masses on April 2nd and 3rd. On Sunday evening at 7:00 p.m., we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, with a homily by Father Samson, concluding with Benediction. Holy Mass will be offered on Monday, April 4th, at 7:00 p.m., followed by an opportunity for the Sacrament of the Anointing. Then on Tuesday, April 5th after the 7:00 p.m. Holy Mass, the Sacrament of God's Loving Forgiveness will be offered with four priests available.



Father Charles Samson was ordained a priest in 2013. Fr. Samson's home parish is St. Clement of Rome in Des Peres. He graduated from St. Louis University High School in 2005, and then entered Cardinal Glennon College seminary. After graduating from Glennon in 2009, Fr. Samson was sent to Rome to undertake advanced studies in theology. He received a Bachelor's in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University in 2012, a License in Sacred Scripture from the Pontifical Biblical Institute in 2015, and then a Doctorate in Sacred Theology from the Gregorian in 2022. His areas of expertise are the Book of Exodus and the Gospel of Matthew, and he specializes in ancient biblical languages and biblical archaeology. Fr. Samson leads the seminarians from Kenrick-Glennon Seminary to the Holy Land every year after Christmas for a three-week long course on biblical archaeology, which he teaches, and pilgrimage. Fr. Samson presently teaches on the faculty at Kenrick-Glennon, and he resides at the Old Cathedral downtown. Fr. Samson loves being a priest, and he enjoys young adult ministry and leading marriage preparations. Fr. Samson has a twin brother, with whom he shares a passion for running, ultimate frisbee, and Star Wars.

When We Surrender to Jesus We Attain True Freedom

I've written before about praying with my kids before school, dedicating the day to Jesus, and giving thanks to our guardian angels for their company, guidance, and protection. Each year, it seems our prayer routine changes in accordance with our morning routines. The prayer itself hasn't changed, just when we say it, whether it's as a group or one on one, during breakfast, in the car, hugging, holding hands, etc. I get misty picturing the kids over the years all fresh and ready for school; the years that have passed by so quickly.

Currently, my older daughter, Millie, and I hug as we pray just before she walks out the door to drive herself and her friends to high school. My younger daughter, Jorie, and I hold hands as we pray on the way to middle school. Next year it will change again, as Jorie will join Millie in high school.

When the kids were young I used to lift up their backpacks when I had my arms around them during prayers to alleviate the weight on their backs, even if just for a minute. These days, as much as I wish I could, I can no longer do it. Millie's backpack is so full with her laptop, books, binders, homework, etc. that it is too heavy and awkward for me to reach around and lift. I have tried, and Millie says, "Mom, don't, it will only make it worse," and it would. I would throw off the balance she created while squatting down and using momentum to sling it solidly over her shoulder.

It occurred to me this morning that I can no longer take on her burdens, and it would be counterproductive if I tried. The most loving thing I can do now is pray, allow her to navigate life's challenges, and encourage her to surrender to Jesus in her times of need:

Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find your rest. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light. (Mt. 11:28-30)

An Excerpt from *Friends of God* By St. Josemaria Escrivá

I insist, and I would like to engrave this deep in your hearts, that freedom and self-surrender are not contradictory. They sustain one another. Freedom can only be given up for love; I cannot conceive any other reason for surrendering it.... When people give themselves freely... freedom renews their love; to be renewed in that way is to always be young, generous, capable of high ideals and great sacrifices.

....

It's because we love freedom that we tie ourselves down. Only pride sees such bonds as a heavy chain. True humility, which is taught to us by the One who is meek and humble of heart, shows that his yoke is easy and his burden light: his yoke is freedom and love and unity; his yoke is the Life which he won for us on the Cross. (Friends of God Freedom #31)
