MASS REQUESTS

You may have a Mass offered for a person who is living or deceased or for a specific intention. (The suggested Mass Stipend in the Archdiocese of St. Louis is \$10.)

If you want a Mass to be said on a particular date, Masses requests are now being scheduled for 2024. Cannon Law requires that all requested Mass intentions be satisfied within

one year of the date the request is made; therefore, we are not able to accept Mass intention requests for a specific date beyond 2024. If you request a specific date which is not available at Annunziata in 2024, we are still able to have the Mass celebrated on your specified date with the help of our Retired and Missionary Priests. Please remember the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is sacred, and prayers reach God no matter where they are offered.

From Our Pastor . . .

Dear Parishioners:

We are halfway through Lent. One of the great gifts of this season is that of reconciliation. Our God yearns for us and wants to forgive us our sins. Besides our confessions time on Saturday's from 3:30-4:45pm. During this Lenten Season confessions will also be heard on Sunday's after our 9:00 am



and 11:00 am liturgies, and on Good Friday after our service. Let us pray for each other as we all strive to grow in holiness and oneness with our God.

Here's what the Sacrament of Reconciliation actually offers:

- \cdot restoration to honesty—no more need to rationalize
- restoration to integrity—no more need to have secret or unacknowledged parts of your life
- relief from unproductive guilt—transformation of remorse into living a new life. The purpose of this sacrament is not punishment but true reconciliation with God and the community.
- an encounter with God—meeting God in humility (not humiliation!) and weakness
- \cdot spiritual guidance—no need to struggle with your moral issues alone
- · inner peace—no longer having to live a life at war with yourself
- strength in meeting future challenges and temptations
- grace—rediscovering, as did the prodigal son, your Father's unconditional love.

Why should you not be afraid of this sacrament? The best reason is that God longs to forgive you. Remember, God knows that you are much more than the worst thing you've ever done. May the good Lord bless you this Lent.

Lenten Events 2024 Lenten Fast and Abstinence

All Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (Mar. 29) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.

Confessions will be heard on **Saturday's** from **3:30** – **4:45** pm and on **Sunday's of Lent** following the 9:00 am and 11:00 am masses and on Good Friday following 7 pm service.

Anointing of the Sick: will take place at weekend masses on Saturday March 9 & Sunday March 10.

Stations of the Cross will be held on Fridays at 2:30 pm and on Good Friday at 12:00 Noon.

Triduum Services at Annunziata will be celebrated on: Holy Thursday March 28: Chrism Mass 10 am at Cathedral Basilica Mass of Last Supper March 28: 7 pm Good Friday Service March 29: 7 pm (Confessions following service) Holy Saturday Vigil March 30: 7:30 pm Easter Sunday March 31 Masses: 9 & 11 am
