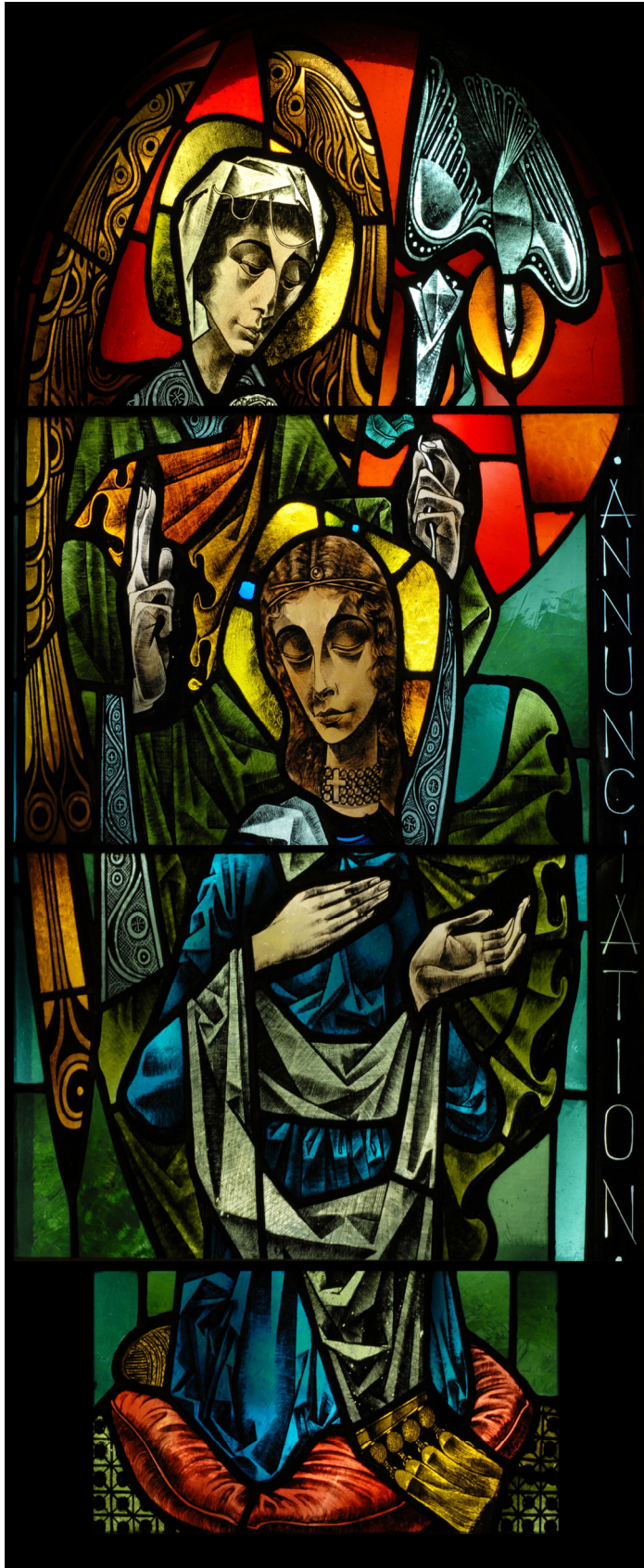

ANNUAL THANKSGIVING APPEAL



There are 142 St. Vincent de Paul Conferences in the St. Louis Archdiocese. Today, we ask the parishioners of Annunziata parish to support our conference by contributing to this year's Thanksgiving Appeal. Please help to sustain our efforts by contributing between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day.

Thank you for your past support for our ministries in the St. Louis metropolitan area and in East St. Louis. Your donation permits us to send money and purchase food for several food pantries, such as Immaculate Conception, St. Augustine, and Holy Trinity. Your funding of the monthly Sandwich Sunday program, done in conjunction with the Annunziata PSR, allows us to deliver food directly to the homeless shelter at St. Peter and Paul. Every winter, we also purchase hats, gloves and warm socks that are distributed to the homeless. Thanks to you, we support Joe's Place, a facility for homeless boys in the Maplewood School District, by purchasing clothing for the four boys each fall. St. Vincent de Paul also organizes Annunziata volunteers who prepare meals for the boys and their houseparents twice each month.

In addition, Annunziata Vincentians meet with individual clients at St. Agatha, St. Pius, St. Rita, Holy Trinity, and Our Lady of Perpetual Help parishes. Our Annunziata hotline permits individuals living in and near the Annunziata parish boundaries to call for help. Several of our Vincentians devote all of their time working with these clients. Thanks to your financial support, Vincentians aid clients by paying for utility bills, rent, food, household items such as cutlery and furniture, and clothing. We also provide employment information and serve as intermediaries with social agencies, such as the police or medical institutions. Vincentians deliver the clothing, food, toiletries, diapers and cleaning products donated by Annunziata parishioners to our ministries in St. Louis and to the Daughters of Charity mission in East St. Louis.

Thus, St. Vincent de Paul not only finances much needed help to the poor, but serves as a parish organizing agency that coordinates volunteer good works by parish members. All of this happens because of your generosity. Thank you and God bless you and your families.
