COME HOLY SPIRIT, AND RENEW THE FACE OF THE EARTH!


On this Pentecost, as we mark the fulfillment of the promise of Jesus to send the Holy Spirit, we remember Christ's teaching, "When the Holy Spirit comes, you will be able to do all the things that I have done, and even greater than these!" The work of the Holy Spirit begins internally: in our hearts, and minds, and souls. The outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, indelibly marks the mission of the Church: it is the work of the Holy Spirit and not the consequences of our ideas and projects.

Since we first receive the Holy Spirit at our Baptism, and then the fullness of the Spirit when we are Confirmed, we need to remember:

- † The Church grows in our community through **attraction**. If you follow Jesus, happy to be attracted to Him, others will take notice.
- † The joy of proclaiming the Gospel always shines brightly against the backdrop of a **grateful** memory. I need to be grateful to God daily.
- † Truth and faith, happiness and salvation are not my own possessions, a goal achieved by my own merits, I don't earn them and I don't deserve them,
- † arrogance and pride have no place. I need to **humble**.
- † With the Holy Spirit, I need to imitate the **patience** of Jesus, who always showed mercy to others as they continue to grow.
- † Jesus met his first disciples on the shore of the Sea of Galilee while they were focused on their work. It has always been the case that Jesus reaches out to **people where they are**.
- † The Holy Spirit helps us remember that we are the People of God, **called and loved by Jesus**. We continue to seek Jesus in the difficulties of our lives, never presuming that we are self sufficient.
- † The Holy Spirit leads to a special **care** for the little ones and the **poor**.

SOMETHING TO PONDER

G.K. Chesterton in his book, "The Everlasting Man" has a chapter entitled, "The Five Deaths of the Faith," in which he recounts a few of the many historical episodes in which the Church was "to all appearances had been hollowed out from within by doubt and indifference." Yet, Christ's Church rose again with new vigor, for "in every such case, the sons and daughters were fanatical for the Faith where the fathers and mothers had been slack about it." God continues to raise up saints, in altogether unlikely places, and Christ's Church not only survives, but is renewed! Have you seriously considered whether YOU are one of those saints?




THE HOLY SPIRIT: THIRD PERSON OF THE TRINITY BY FR. SHANNON
