FROM OUR PASTOR.....

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

My letter on re-opening public Masses at the Church of the Annunziata was mailed last Wednesday. A great deal of prayer, thought, and consultation went into the parish letter in light of the "Archdiocesan Guidelines for Observing Social Distancing and other Health Requirements for the Celebration of Mass" that were issued on May 12.

Details were given in the letter so that everyone will be safe and all will arrive knowing what to expect. The highlights are:

- 1) Public Masses at Annunziata will begin on Thursday, May 28th.
- 2) Monday thru Saturday: Mass at 7 a.m. Saturday Vigil Mass at 5p.m.; Sundays, 7a.m., 9 a.m., 11 a.m. This Mass Schedule insures that our Church may be cleaned, disinfected, and sanitized after every Mass.
- 3) Dispensation of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues until further notice.
- 4) Anyone over 60 years-old and those with underlying health complications are encouraged to participate in Masses via live-stream only.
- 5) Please take your temperature at home before determining whether you should attend Mass.
- 6) The faithful are obliged to wear a mask during Mass, except for the brief moment of receiving Holy Communion.
- 7) You will be asked to stay at least 6 feet from people not in your household.

POPE SAINT JOHN PAUL II

John Paul II was born 100 years' ago on May 18th. As Priest, Bishop, and Pope, he preached solidarity, he embodied solidarity, and he called people to a deeper solidarity because he was a radically converted Christian disciple: one who believed in the depth of his being that — salvation history — the story of God's self-revelation to the People of Israel and ultimately in Jesus Christ—is the deepest truth, the inner truth, of world history. John Paul II, who was likely seen in person by more people than any human being in history, could move millions because the Grace of God shone through him, ennobling all whom its brightness and warmth touched. That was the key to the John Paul II effect: radiant, Christ-centered faith!



The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a *new system for safe* environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. Everyone (clergy, employees and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required to register in the new system before December 31, 2020. This includes those new to service as well as those who are currently compliant and in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children

workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new on-line training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethics Conduct, and agree to the updated code of Ethical Conduct.

Please go to www.preventand protectstl.org: select the 'register' link and enter 'stlprotect' for the passcode. Then create your username and password for this new system.
