

help us always to know the love of your Son, Jesus.*



FROM OUR PASTOR.....

A TIME FOR DISCERNMENT

Everyday we are offered advice on Covid-19, on civil unrest in our society, on how to move beyond racism, and so many other issues in our world today. Being able to tell right from wrong is a clear element of not only moral conscience but of spiritual growth as well.



The Gospel of John tells us “The sheep hear Christ’s voice, as He calls His own sheep by name and leads them out.” The Lord calls us by name because He loves us. But, the Gospel then tells us, there are other voices, not to be followed: those of strangers, thieves and brigands who mean to harm the sheep.

These different voices resonate within us. There is the voice of God, who speaks kindly to the conscience, and there is the tempting voice that leads to evil. One can learn to discern these two voices: they speak two different languages. Pope Francis offers a mini lesson on discernment:

AM I STILL FREE? The voice of God never forces us: God proposes Himself, God does not impose Himself. The evil voice seduces, assails, forces: it arouses dazzling illusions, emotions that are tempting but transient.

AM I BEING FLATTERED? At first it flatters, it makes us believe that we are all-powerful, but then it leaves us empty and accuses us: You are worth nothing.” The voice of God, instead, corrects us with great patience, but always encourages us, consoles us: it always nourishes hope.

AM I LOOKING FORWARD? The voice of God is a voice that has a horizon, whereas the voice of evil leads you to a wall, it backs you into a corner.

AM I IN THE PRESENT MOMENT? The voice of the enemy distracts us from the present and wants us to focus on fears of the future or sadness about the past—the enemy does not want the present—it brings to the surface the bitterness, the memories of wrongs suffered, of those who have hurt us, and many bad memories. Instead, the voice of God speaks to the present: “Now you can do good, now you can exercise the creativity of love, now you can renounce regrets and remorse that hold your heart captive.” God’s voice inspires us, leads us ahead, and speaks in the present.

IS IT ABOUT MY EGO? The tempter will insist on “What do I feel like doing?” What I feel like: the evil voice always revolves around the ego, its impulses, and its needs. The voice of God never promises joy at a low price: it invites us to go beyond our ego to find the true good, Peace!


WHAT AFTERTASTE DOES IT LEAVE? Evil never gives us peace, it causes frenzy first and leaves bitterness later.

AM I SEEKING LIGHT OR HIDING? The Lord loves sunlight, truth, and sincere transparency! The evil one prefers darkness, falsehood, and gossip.

AM I LED TO TRUST? Goodness invites us to open up, to be clear and trusting in God and in others. Evil says, “Close yourself up in yourself, besides, no-one understands and listens to you, don’t trust anyone!”

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a ***new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL***. Everyone (clergy, employees and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required to register in the new system before December 31, 2020. This includes those new to service as well as those who are currently compliant and in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new on-line training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethics Conduct, and agree to the updated code of Ethical Conduct.
