

THE SANCTUARY OF OUR CHURCH

Our Maintenance Staff began plans to clean the baldacchino above the Altar, fixing and replacing lighting in the baldacchino, making plans for cleaning the drape behind the Tabernacle, repairing the connectors holding the drape and replacing the rod that supports it.

When inquiries were made regarding the cleaning of our existing drape, we found that it does not meet the code (NFPA 701) for fire-retardancy. Between the cost of cleaning and making the present drape fire retardant, we were told it would be extremely expensive and problematic.

We are considering a new drape of a deep dove gray color, lined, and completely compliant with the fire code. The new drape would be lighted from above. Because of the new color, we would have the opportunity to light the drape in keeping with the liturgical seasons: green for ordinary time, purple for Advent and Lent, white/gold for Christmas and Easter Season, and red for Pentecost and the feast days of the martyrs of the Church. The color would always be pre-set to coincide with the liturgy and would never change during the celebration of the Mass.

We are making a video which should be online after Labor Day. (Please note, the sample of the drape in the video is not the color we are proposing. A small piece of the deep dove gray is being held up in front of the drape at the end of this video so that you might see an example of how the lighting reflects off the darker fabric, creating a much deeper colored background. In addition, the camera colors do not appear nearly as vibrant and rich as what you will see in church. The color purple appears blue on camera; other colors lack depth on camera.)


