FROM OUR PASTOR.....

"Every faculty you have, your power of thinking or of moving your limbs from moment to moment, is given you by God. If you devoted every moment of your life exclusively to God's service, you could not give God anything that was not in a sense God's already." — C.S. Lewis



The fundamental principle of biblical stewardship is that God owns everything, we are simply managers or administrators acting on God's behalf. "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in the world, and all who live in it." (Psalm 24)

Whether you have been a Parishioner of Annunziata all your life, or you are one of the seven Families who newly registered in the month of September, please know you are prayed for at Mass everyday of the year. Because of the coronavirus we have not interacted very much since March 16th. Our Parish School of Religion is online this first semester. Special thanks to our Parents and volunteer Teachers who have adapted so well in helping our children grow in their Catholic Faith.

I know we all miss our Parish Picnic with the opportunity to be together and share a wonderful picnic lunch and see so many of our children having a most enjoyable time. We regret that this year we will not be able to have our November Parish Dinner.

While we could not have our First Holy Communion as a class in May, each child and their family was able to celebrate individually at a Sunday Mass during the last several months. In addition, our former Archbishop Robert Carlson, while postponing the Spring Confirmation Masses, delegated the Pastors to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation. With social distancing and masks, we were able to have Confirmation Masses on August 25, September 2nd and 10th. (The live-streamed Masses for First Holy Communions and Confirmations were downloaded to a USB drive and sent to their families as a special memento.)

While our Church is limited to 80 people by the Covid-19 guidelines, I believe it is honest to say that our Church is one of the safest places to come in St. Louis County. Annunziata is cleaned and sanitized after every weekday and Sunday Mass, after every Baptism, Wedding, and Funeral.

Our pews are ribboned to assure that every family unit is six feet apart, but be assured that you are most welcome! (With the obligation for Sunday Mass suspended, we continue to remind everyone of the advice of great Doctors and Nurses, and Health Care Professionals—those who are sick should not come, those with underlying conditions, and those who are uncomfortable, are supported in their decision to remain at home.)

You have seen on the Parish website (www.annunziata.org) that daily and Sunday Masses are live-streamed, the Sunday bulletin is available, and there is a free membership for your Family on FORMED. FORMED can keep you entertained, informed, and connected to your Catholic Faith. I call it the Catholic Faith on demand—movies, creative videos, courses, programs, and devotions that inspire you to understand and live your Catholic Faith in a deeper and loving way.

With Masses being suspended for two and a half months, and re-opening for Masses limiting our capacity to 80 persons, we are very grateful to those who are able to contribute to the support of your Parish. Thanks to those who were able to cover the costs of several important projects: the Heating and Air-Conditioning unit for our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel, the new sound system for Church, the upgrade to install fire-code push bars for the front and west side Church doors, the replacement of the cables for all the lights in the nave of the Church, and the upgrade of the lighting to LED in the Church and School. While the offertory collection has been lower since March, we applied for and received an SBA PPP Loan of \$83,043 during the Covid-19 crisis to cover payroll, etc. The entire amount will be forgiven and shown as income in the 2020/2021 fiscal year.

I, like you, am deeply saddened by the death and devastation that individuals in Louisiana and surrounding states are experiencing in the aftermath of Hurricane Laura and the wildfires in California. Besides the loss of life, we have seen thousands of homes, businesses and churches severely damaged or destroyed. The impacts will be long lasting. I ask the Lord to carry those who have lost loved ones and those suffering in the aftermath.

To help provide immediate and long-term aid to those recovering from these disasters, I am asking our nearly 185 parishes in 11 counties to participate in a second collection at all Masses during a weekend later this month or in early October. The funds collected in this special

appeal will become part of the Bishops Emergency Disaster Fund and will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and/or Catholic Relief Services, the office relief agencies of the U.S. Catholic Church. We join other dioceses across the country in this response for

support to help with water, food, shelter, and medical care, along with long-term rebuilding and recovery efforts. The funds will be distributed where they are most needed.

We recognize that parish and diocesan activities have been severely impacted by COVID-19 and the local capacity for fund-raising may be more challenging than with past emergency collections. However, we know people are generous in time of need. If we all give a little, it can make a huge difference.

I will be offering a Mass for those who died in these tragedies, as well as their loved ones who are mourning and recovering. Please pray for our neighbors who must now rebuild their lives.


Lectio: Mark
