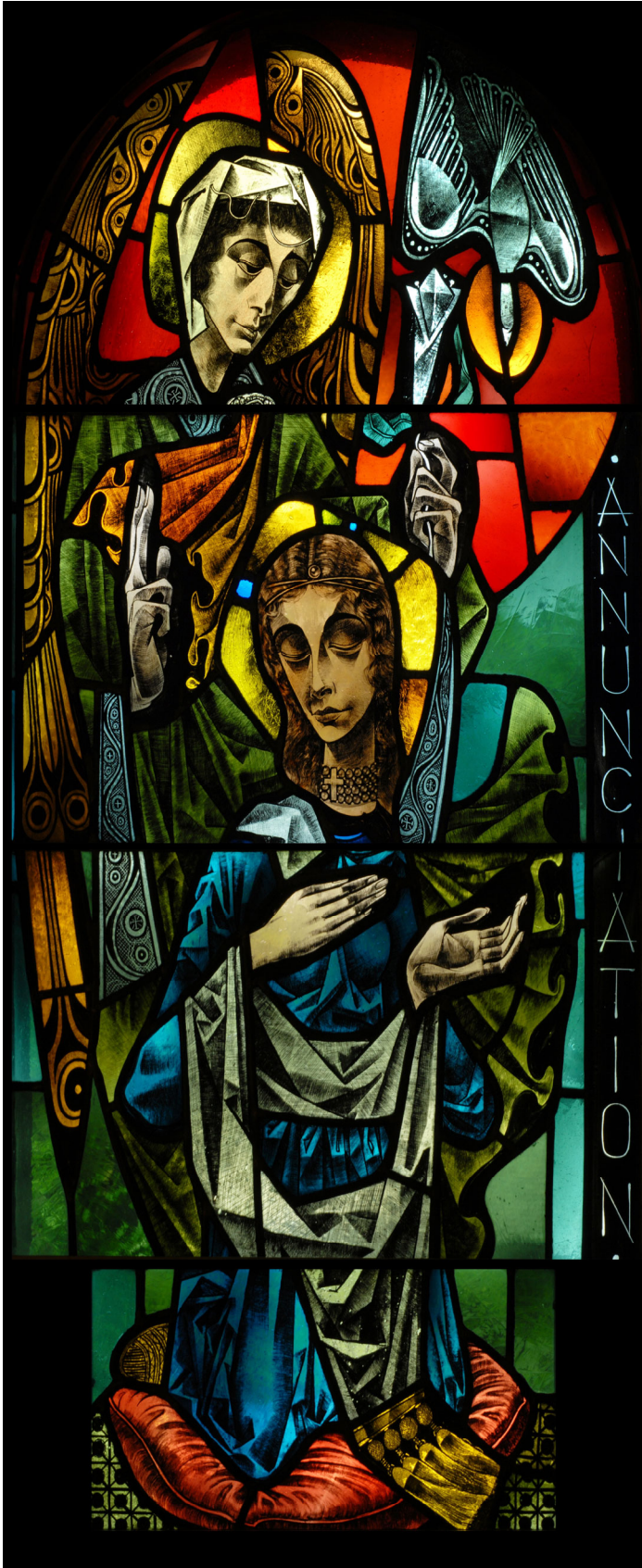

## 50 Minutes Flies By... Join Us PSR Parent Coffee Sundays during PSR classes in Faris Hall

### *Everyone vs. the Bad Guy*

**“But, .everyone has it!” “Everyone wears this!” “Everyone says that!” “Everyone is going...”  
Everyone else...”**

With a middle schooler and two high school aged kids, I find myself fielding comments about what rules apply in our home versus the homes of other kids. Oftentimes, phrases like, “but, we’re the only ones,” “it’s so embarrassing,” and “what am I supposed to say...” are peppered throughout the conversations. I hear myself saying the same thing my mom said to me, “Just tell them your mom said, ‘NO.’ You can always make me the bad guy.”

I don’t envy adolescents today. Between school work, sports, clubs, friends, trends, media and all the rest, it’s difficult to keep up. Doing what everyone else is doing, saying, wearing... would seemingly keep things simple. If my parenting rules aren’t the same as *everyone* else’s, am I making life harder on my kids? I often find myself thinking back, trying to remember what was important to me and how I felt about things.

The only “media” I had in high school was the bag phone in my car for emergencies only. My graduating class was the last to learn to type on an actual typewriter! The word “media” really didn’t mean the same thing then as it does today. Today, we carry an all-access device with us everywhere we go. The mobile phone pings; someone bids for our attention. To me, it’s irritating. But, our kids have grown up with constant connections and without them begin to worry: Where is *everyone*? What is *everyone* doing? Is *everyone* existing without me?

Finding the sweet spot between independence, individuality and where I fit in the all-important group as a teenager was both exciting and scary, but I remember having ample time alone to discern. Time alone without worrying about *everyone* else.

Have I helped my children understand the beautiful individual God made them to be and how much God loves them? Have I taught them that God made us in such a way that we are not meant for worry? Do they know that they are never alone in the world and that God is always with them? As the season changes, let’s do a family refocus, remembering that God made us in his likeness and loves each one of us apart from *everyone* else.

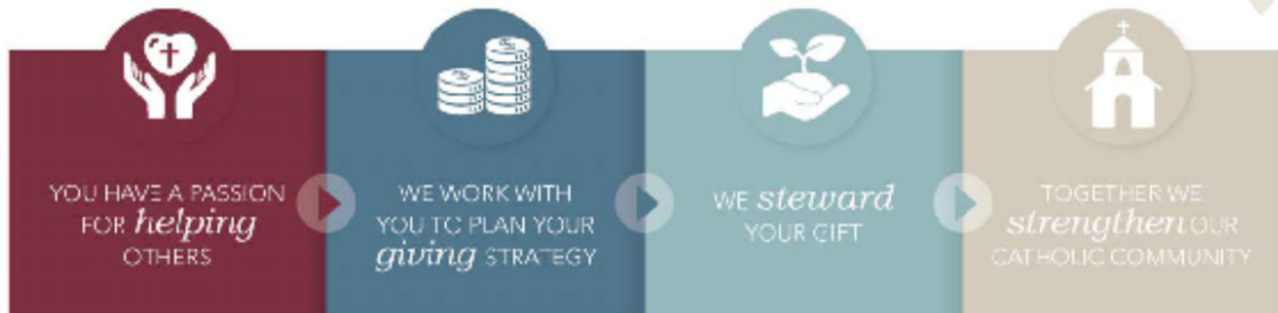
