DISCERNMENT

I am hoping that everyone will think about, reflect on, and pray for wisdom regarding the question: “Shall I go to Mass, or not?” To help you with your discernment process, let’s remember what Archbishop Carlson has written in the Archdiocesan Guidelines:



- 1) Public Masses at Annunziata will begin on Thursday, May 28th.
- 2) Monday thru Saturday: Mass at 7 a.m.
Saturday Vigil Mass at 5p.m.; Sundays, 7a.m., 9 a.m., 11 a.m.
This Mass Schedule insures that our Church may be cleaned, disinfected, and sanitized after every Mass.
- 3) Dispensation of the obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues until further notice.
- 4) Anyone over 60 years-old and those with underlying health complications are encouraged to participate in Masses via live-stream only.
- 5) Please take your temperature at home before determining whether you should attend Mass.
- 6) The faithful are obliged to wear a mask during Mass, except for the brief moment of receiving Holy Communion.
- 7) You will be asked to stay at least 6 feet from people not in your household.

AN ACT OF CHARITY: WEARING A MASK

Dr. Barbara Golder, a physician, lawyer and bioethicist with a background in pathology states: “The simple reason to wear a mask is primarily to protect others, the secondary reason is to protect oneself. Masks are a barrier to the airborne droplets that can carry the virus and infect anyone who breathes them in.” Dr. Golder goes on to say that wearing a mask while in Church is “a small thing to do, and it may well save lives. Wearing a mask in public can be an act of charity for one’s neighbor.”

The eminent Doctor stated, “We now know that the novel coronavirus is communicable by aerosol droplets that are expelled by coughing, sneezing, and even, to a certain extent, by breathing. We also know that this happens even in people who are infected and shedding virus but who do not have symptoms. For this reason masks—along with social distancing—are an important tool in fighting the spread of the disease. Remember: wearing a mask limits the possibility of dispersing infective particles in the air, as well as reducing the risk of inhaling them.”
