

FROM OUR PASTOR.....

A 90th ANNIVERSARY PROPOSAL

Dear Parishioners,



The Church of the Annunziata is your Parish! As we look back over these 90 years since the Archbishiop of St. Louis established our Parish, and appointed Father Charleville Faris its founding pastor, previous generations have left us a great legacy to build on.

As we grow forward, any proposal will only succeed with prayer and involvement. To be a good steward, each of us, in her or his own way, need to do our part to build community. In study after study, Catholics are looking for a parish with a welcoming, joyful attitude, a parish with a vision for reaching the lost, and a plan for the spiritual growth and maturity of their members.

The fifth book of the New Testament, where the Church in its first, purest, and most heroic expression is described, is called ACTS. They acted; they did things. Specifically, they did what the Lord told them to do.

As Catholics, the Eucharist (the Mass) is "the source and summit" of our Christian life and worship because it is Christ Himself.

- 1) What could you do to encourage someone you know to come to Sunday Mass?
- 2) Would you invite someone to go with you?
- 3) Would you share with someone what Sunday Mass means to you?

But the "source: and Summit necessarily means there has got to be something in between. Serious followers of Christ grow in the love of God's Word through Scripture:

- 1) Men, would you consider coming to Men's Bible Study every other Monday from 7:30 a.m. to 8:15 a.m. from September through May?
- Women, would you consider coming to Cornerstone Bible Study on Thursdays from 9:00 to 10:30 a.m. from September through April?

A few minutes alone with God each day, away from texting and technology, can be a great place to start:

- 1) Is the Holy Spirit calling you to spend a few minutes in Eucharistic Adoration at the Carmelites or in Annunziata's Eucharistic Chapel on Mondays or Thursdays?
- 2) Could you pray a decade of the rosary each day?
- 3) In your quiet time, is God leading you to go to the Sacrament of Penance, even though it has been awhile or you just plain forgot how?

Jesus commanded, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. To love your neighbor as yourself, you have got to —love yourself. Disciples love themselves not by indulging themselves, but rather by taking care of themselves.

Jesus invested time in his own self-care. Time and again in the gospels, Jesus withdraws from the crowds and even from his friends for quiet time alone. There He refreshes Himself and renews His relationship with His Heavenly Father. Obviously Jesus pours Himself into the lives of others, but only after He allows Himself to be filled up.

- Could I daily or weekly take some time for spiritual reading or videos about my Catholic Faith? Since Annunziata has a membership for each Parishioner with "Formed", could I avail myself of their first rate videos? (More information about "Formed" in next week's bulletin.)
- 2) Would I consider being a part of our Parish's outreach to those in need through our St. Vincent dePaul Society?

A Note from Deacon Tom... the Deacon Formation Collection

The ordination of the first permanent deacons for the Archdiocese of St. Louis took place in 1977. Over these past four decades, hundreds of deacons in our Archdiocese have volunteered countless hours, actively modeling the Gospel through lives of service. Deacons are ordained ministers who proclaim and preach God's Word and perform various sacramental duties such as baptisms, weddings and funerals. In addition to their parish assignments, many also work within nursing homes, hospitals, hospices, prisons, schools and airport chapels. A few even function as parish co-administrators or Parish Life Coordinators. Most also have full time jobs in addition to their non-paying deacon assignments. Every other year, several dozen men begin the demanding five-year process of formation. The Deacon Formation Collection the weekend of October 5-6 is the primary means of funding for this formation program, in addition to the tuition paid by the candidates. Your contributions are essential. Please give generously. It has been a privilege to serve at Church of the Annunziata for over 13 years and I sincerely appreciate the support you've shown for this very important collection.
