

This exploration makes it unmistakably clear that the Eucharist is not merely a symbol, but is indeed Jesus Christ Himself — fervently desiring to quench our spiritual thirst with His boundless love.

The participants' spiritual growth is encouraged and enhanced through weekly reflection on God's Word and the teachings of Catholic doctrine and traditions. - 7. Your spouse is not Catholic, and might be interested in joining our Church as your children are receiving first communion or confirmation.
- 8. You are Catholic, and would like to learn current Church teaching and practice.
- 9. You've heard it is a great experience.
- 10. God is calling you.
